

## \$3.8 Million in Grants Awarded for First Quarter

\$1 Million goes to Pottawattamie County Preschool Program

"Many Iowa West Foundation grants this quarter will help meet needs of children," said Todd Graham, President and CEO of the Iowa West Foundation, "with the largest of those being a \$1 million grant for early childhood education in Pottawattamie County schools."

Graham explained that the preschool grant went to Loess Hills Area Education Agency 13, which provides the funding to the local districts in the county. The \$1 million grant brings the Foundation's support of the Pottawattamie County preschool program to \$9.3 million over the past eight years.

"Early childhood learning programs are critical for the development of our youth," stated Glenn Grove, Administrator of the Loess Hills Area Education Agency. "Iowa West's recognition of this importance and the Foundation's grant award will help

leverage our other funding to keep the program at a quality level," he added.

Graham highlighted other grants for children related programs (in alphabetical order):

\$5,000 for a summer camp for Omaha metro area children with asthma organized by the American Lung Association of the Central States;

\$30,000 for a Big Brothers Big Sisters pilot program for school-based mentoring at Lewis & Clark Elementary School in Council Bluffs;

\$14,000 to the Children's Center for an additional childcare site to serve Council Bluffs and southwest lowa;

\$20,000 for renovations to a Little League baseball complex in Harlan;

\$10,000 for Discovery Dome and Mobile Planetarium programs at the Omaha Children's Museum;

\$15,000 support for childhood lead-poisoning prevention program efforts by Omaha Healthy Kids Alliance; and

\$30,000 for construction of an early childhood center playground at Southwest lowa Family Services, Inc., located in Atlantic.

The lowa West Foundation, which is headquartered in Council Bluffs, receives its funding for grants from investment income and also from the lowa West Racing Association.
